The Red Hot Chili Peppers are an American rock band formed in Los Angeles in 1983. The group's musical style primarily consists of rock with an emphasis on funk, as well as elements from other genres such as punk rock and psychedelic rock. When played live, their music incorporates elements of jam band due to the improvised nature of much of their performances.

The band's history can be traced back to 1980 when vocalist/guitarist Anthony Kiedis, bassist Michael "Flea" Balzary, and drummer Jack Irons formed a band called Tony Flow and the Miraculously Majestic Masters of Mayhem. The group's first public performance was at L.A.'s Rhythm Lounge. In 1982, the band added guitarist Hillel Slovak and changed their name to Red Hot Chili Peppers.

Slovak died of a heroin overdose in 1988, and Irons left the band shortly thereafter. The remaining members recruited guitarist John Frusciante and drummer Chad Smith, and the group recorded Mother's Milk (1989). The album became an underground success, but it was not until 1991's Blood Sugar Sex Magik that the Chili Peppers achieved widespread commercial success with singles such as "Give It Away" and "Under the Bridge".

After a world tour in support of Blood Sugar Sex Magik, Frusciante grew uncomfortable with the band's popularity and quit abruptly in 1992 in the middle of the tour. He was replaced by Arik Marshall for the remainder of the tour but Marshall was not asked to join the band permanently. Determined to continue, Kiedis and Flea recruited guitarist Dave Navarro for 1995's One Hot Minute. Despite positive reviews, One Hot Minute failed to match the sales or radio airplay of Blood Sugar Sex Magik and Frusciante rejoined the Chili Peppers in 1998.

The reunion resulted in 1999's Californication, which became the band's most successful album worldwide. It was followed by 2002's By the Way and 2006's Stadium Arcadium. After a five-year hiatus, they released I'm with You in 2011. In 2016, they were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.
